## LANDSCAPING ~ Don Chute

You may be asking yourself what all those little flags are for dotted around Fairway Circle and going in and out of the plazas? What do they represent?

These last few months there has been much going on behind the scenes to develop a detailed plan for the future look, maintenance and the overall beautification of the Fairways. This requires many hours spent by Landscape committee volunteers, but also involves outside vendors, landscaping experts and city and governing planning agencies. Many of them need to be on-site and walk the property in order to develop bid proposals, landscaping plans and advise the committee on how to access grants or receive direction to obtain approvals from the numerous, but necessary, city and county agencies. These flags and their temporary placement throughout the



Fairways simply create an easy visiual 'picture or pattern' of one of the many future landscaping ideas being developed. This is preliminary work that needs to be completed prior to finalizing the overall master landscaping plan for the community. Please be assured that the Landscaping Committee is committed 100% to improving the communication within the community, and before proceeding with any major project such as this "Ribbon Project" (as it has become referred to), we will do our best to involve all of the community for feedback when plans are finalized and can be presented to you.

Additionally, the Landscape Committee has also recognized improvements are needed to existing areas of the landscaping. Some of these include dealing with the bare, dead grass areas by adjusting irrigation and sprinkler heads to maximize water efficiency and coverage, based on



the guidelines of Desert Water Management, which is limited to watering of grass, trees and shrub beds to two times per day throughout the summer months even though hotter temperatures are upon us. Reseeding, aeration and scalping will take place in late September-early October and we hope to see those areas recover then. Ongoing efforts such as weeding and desertscape maintenance of common areas are also being addressed and will be included in a revised maintenance scope of work with the landcspape company. Please know we are committed to addressing these areas in a timely manner, and working with our landscape maintenance supplier and Desert Management to do so.

We appreciate everyone's ideas, thoughts and efforts! Please continue to bring your concerns to Rhianna via email at RBeverly@DesertManagement.com or at (760) 459-3054; she will deal with the provider and continue to communicate to the committee and Board to make sure issues are resolved. Additionally, so as not to create wrong perceptions or assumptions, if you have concerns about what you are seeing or hearing in the neighborhood, please just reach out to the Landscape Committee or Rhianna. We are all working towards the same goal and that is to have the best looking and planned community in the desert that protects and increases all of our investments. Thank you all for your continued patience and support!

# **DESERT MANAGMENT** ~ Rhianna Beverly

**KEEP ALERT!** Coyotes Sighted in our Neighborhood: People with pets need to be very careful of Coyotes. I am getting reports of them sneaking up behind people walking their dogs trying to snatch their dog. Coyotes can be active any time of day or night.

## What to do if a coyote is approaching you and your dog?

1) First and foremost, stop and stand still- remain calm. 2) Keep eye contact. 3) If you have a small dog, pick it up. 4) Make yourself big - be loud and assertive! 5) Slowly back away and **NEVER** turn your back and run while leaving the area, as you may trigger its predatory response and give it a reason to chase you. If you have any personal alarm devices, such as a whistle, bell, or phone alarm, use them to scare the coyote. You can also purchase a small pocket airhorn or pepper spray from Walmart or other shops.

**Other ways of protecting you and your dog:** 1) Never leave your dog outside unattended. 2) Walk in groups (2 or more people). 3) Always keep your pet leashed and close to you while walking. 4) Bring your pets (and their pet food) indoors at night. 5) Pick up ripening fruit from surrounding trees as fruit is a staple of coyote diets. 6) Cover all garbage cans.

**Coyote Vest:** Another preventative device you may choose to purchase especially for smaller dogs is a Coyote Vest (pictured here) sold on Amazon. It looks rather silly and has large plastic spikes that can be velcroed onto the vest. Although the vest is not guaranteed to ward off an attack, it has been reported to reduce life threatening injuries to a dog in the event an attack occurs.

# What is Organic Recycling - Green Trash Cans

Organic Recycling is Here.....Those green trash cans that arrived a few months ago in the Fairways Neighborhood that were placed in or near each dumpster area are for Organic Recycling.

#### So what is Organic Recycling?

Organic waste consists of Yard Waste (like plants, trimmings and grass clippings) and Food Scraps (such as cooked meat, produce, and dairy, as well as food-soiled paper plates and paper products, coffee grounds, tea bags and the like).

#### Do I Have to Participate?

Yes. Residents are required by the State of California and City of Palm Springs to recycle all organic waste. The State of California passed Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) to decrease greenhouse gas emissions and slow climate change. SB 1383 requires every city in California to provide organic waste collection services to all residents and businesses. This mandate is intended to reduce the amount of organic waste going to landfills by 75% by 2025. Read more at CalRecycle.com

#### What Goes in the Organic Recycling Green Can?

Items You Can Place in the Green Can: Coffee Grounds • Cooked Meat including Bones • Food Scraps • Food Soiled Paper • Grass Clippings • Leaves • Palm Fronds • Tea Bags • Tree + Shrub Trimmings • Twigs + Small Branches • Yard Trimmings • Weeds Place your FOOD WASTE in a clear plastic or white bag. Place the bag in the green can along with the loose yard waste or clippings. Bagging your food will help with odor as well as with the sorting process at the processing facility.

#### What DOES NOT go in the Green Can?

These Items are NOT Acceptable: Aluminum Cans • Animal Waste • Concrete • Dirt • Electronic Waste • Foam or Plastic Food Containers• Glass Jars & Containers • Plastic Food Containers • Raw Meat • Rocks + Gravel
