### **SECURITY**~ Noah Weinreb NEW SECURITY COMPANY:

A few months ago, the HOA Board hired a new security company called **Securitas**.



Nightly, they perform mobile patrol inspections in and

around the Fairways neighborhood. They also check all Clubhouse doors are secure, patrol each street and stop at each pool area to physically walk around the perimeters of the pool areas to ensure that pathway and pool lights are working properly, pool gates are closed and of course, intruders are not present in and around the areas.

### **NEW CAMERA AT FRONT GATE:**

Additionally a new security camera at the Front Entry Gate has been installed. This camera monitors all gate activity 24/7.

There have been a few instances of nonresidents wandering into the neighborhood or residents' cars parked in carports that

### LANDSCAPE~Jay Center

Spring is in full swing and we have had some amazing weather that has promoted our landscape to wake up from winter dormancy. With a fair amount of rain this last winter and spring, watering of grass and shrub beds has increased to two times daily based on the guidelines of Desert Water Management. As the weather begins to warm you will see a slowing in hedge and shrub trimming to prevent undue stress on vegetation.

The landscape committee has recognized areas of improvement that need attention. We are committed to addressing these areas in a timely manner, working with our landscape maintenance supplier, Exceptional, and Desert Management to assist with fixing these deficiencies. Your support is appreciated as a community. If you see a broken sprinkler, place a flag, and or contact Rhianna.

### FACILITIES~ Kirk Gardner

Throughout the Spring, the Clubhouse Facilities Team (Geoff Cross, Bill Albert, Kirk Gardner and various project specific community volunteers) were very



busy with various projects throughout the community:

- <u>Pool #5</u>: Installed Desert Scape rock and Weedloc around the exterior pool enclosure. Able assistance was provided by **Rich Herbert, Frank Perra and our on-site landscape crew.** As a thank you to the crew and volunteers, lunch was provided from the local restaurant Goody's.
- <u>Perimeter Security Lighting:</u> Three perimeter wall security lights were purchased and installed that are now the standard. These walpac lights have three intensity settings to allow for adjustment in locations where overly bright security lights may be intrusive.
- Repainting/Repair of Brick Columns: Geoff Cross has been engaged in a project to repaint the brick columns thru out the Fairways. It is an ongoing project that will take at least next season plus to complete. Geoff also repaired 4 brick columns at a minimal cost of \$20. Had this repair been completed by an outside vendor, it would have cost the HOA \$1000.
- <u>Landscape Shed Secure</u>: The landscape shed, that had previously been broken into, was upgraded with two new security bars that are 10' long which is 4' longer than the originals. These new ones are very hard to breach and disconnect the retainer pins like the shorter old ones. **Bill Albert, Geoff Cross, Rich Herbert and Frank Perra** completed repainting the shed with Bill reworking the lighting so it now has night security lightning and work lights.
- <u>Unit Secured:</u> Bill Albert secured a problematic unit that was being broken into by intruders. He and his wife resolved a repeat intruder issue by suggesting a viable option that virtually eliminated further intruder issues.

The committee is now off site at our various summer locations but we will be back in October. We will be focused on repainting/repairing the lamp posts, curbs and parking lot striping as well as the Clubhouse patio area as these areas are highly visible and need to be kept in good order.

1) Pool heating has been turned off and is not scheduled to be turned back on until approximately October 1st. However with hotter



days coming, the pool temperatures heat up quite nicely especially in the late afternoon/early evening providing refreshing relief from the desert heat! And 2) please be advised that the pool and spa areas are not monitored by the HOA. For health and safety reasons, children are not allowed in the pool and spa areas unsupervised and need to be accompained and under the direct supervision of an adult 18 years and older at all times!

### Who Knew? ~ Who is Lawrence Crossley & Why is a Street Named After Him?

After living in The Fairways for almost a year now, I have often pondered this very question each time I drive through the entry gate and turn onto Lawrence Crossley Drive. Here's what I found out ...

### <u>Lawrence Crossley (1899-1962) – Palm Springs' First Black Entrepreneur</u>

Excerpts below were written by Barbara Beckley for Visit Palm Springs (https://visitpalmsprings.com/lawrence-crossley-makes-mark-in-palm-springs)

"Smart and ambitious – New Orleans trumpet player Lawrence Crossley saw opportunities in Palm Springs early on, relocating from The Big Easy in the 1920s with his wife and two daughters to take a position as chauffeur to Prescott Stevens, owner of the El Mirador Hotel. Recognizing Crossley's business sense, Stevens quickly promoted him to assist in the development of the hotel and to design Palm Springs first 18-hole golf course, the El Mirador Golf Course...Later, he became superintendent of grounds for the Palm Springs estate of wealthy New York attorney Samuel Untermyer, now The Willows Historic Palm Springs Inn. These and other corporate moguls encouraged Crossley to invest for himself, which he did — with stellar success. Crossley started his own water business, the Tramview Water Company; opened a small café and a laundromat...As a well-established and respected mover and shaker, Crossley also worked closely with the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians and was active in civic affairs on behalf of school bond issues and the College of the Desert...



...In the early 1930s, Crossley acquired some five acres, near East Ramon Road and South Sunrise Way, which he developed into Crossley Court, the first-known example of land ownership by an African American in Palm Springs. He also created Tramview Village and the Eagle Canyon Trailer Village. Crossley purchased more land, this time a large tract which he subdivided in the late 1950s (in partnership with the Sun-Spa Development Corporation's President Al Casey). Built to FHA standards, Crossley Tract, as his 77-parcel neighborhood was called, featured affordable three-bedroom, two-bath homes in a variety of floorplans targeted primarily to African American families. Amenities included paved streets, natural gas and school bus service. Crossley Tract boomed. In late 1958, the first home was move-in ready. News reports show Crossley and his wife, Martha, moving into their new residence across from the model home. By 1961, 30 homes were built and bought. Unfortunately tragedy struck in 1962, when

...In July of 2015, the Palm Springs Planning Commission agreed unanimously to change the name of the street that connects Ramon Road to East Palm Canyon Drive. At the time it had two names, Golf Club Drive on the south and Crossley Road on the north. The commission decided to name the entire street Crossley Road in honor of Lawrence Crossley one of the earliest African-American residents in Palm Springs..."
