LANDSCAPING ~ Jay Center/Don Chute

Scalping and overseeding were completed last week and are important steps in maintaining a healthy and vibrant lawn. By removing the dead thatch and overseeding with new grass seeds, you promote better germination and filling in bare or thin areas.



Now that watering has started, it will provide the essential moisture needed for the newly seeded areas to grow. With regular watering, you should start seeing signs of greening in the lawn soon. As the grass seeds germinate and develop, the lawn will become denser and more lush.

In addition to seeding, maintaining an efficient irrigation system is crucial for a healthy and sustainable landscape. Our current system is older, and it's common for various components such as valves, sprinkler heads, and irrigation lines to require repairs or replacements over time. By addressing these issues, Conserve LandCare has taken an important step towards ensuring our system functions optimally.

Replacing sprinkler heads and making necessary repairs not only helps in the germination process of your winter grass but also improves water efficiency. By fixing leaks, correcting misaligned sprinklers, and updating outdated components, you can reduce water waste and ensure that our irrigation system delivers water precisely where and when needed. Efficient irrigation not only saves water but also promotes healthier plants and turf. Additionally, it can lead to cost savings in water bills. Below are photos of replaced sprinkler heads and sprinkler line repairs from just October!

<u>LIGHTING:</u> The recent rain this summer caused a number of street, pool and landscape lights to short out or fall over.

- We were able to restore the light string around Pool #6 and Tam 'O Shanter Plaza;
- The light strings that service Wack Wack Plaza, Pool #5, Pinehurst Plaza and St. Andrews Plaza were restored by Conserve Landscaping;



- The Pool #3 security light had fallen over. We cement anchored it in its upright position;
- Additionally, Pool #5 and #6 are having intermittent light issues (the light in the pool) which are being addressed.

If you see any lights that are not operational, please use the flags located at the refuse enclosures to mark them for repair, and also email Rhianna.

<u>CLUBHOUSE:</u> The Clubhouse patio area was pressure washed and the table and chairs were cleaned. Eva, our Clubhouse cleaning person, regularly services the patio area. For future, it would be most appreciated if bike riders would not ride through the patio area as it leaves tire marks on the surface that are hard to mop away.

- The Clubhouse parking area is being restriped and should be completed the first week of November.
- The red curbs will also be started and completed by the 3rd week of November.




Both pool heaters have been turned on and should be warm by now.

Community Member Spotlight: Darlene Backlund



Did you know longtime Fairways resident, Darlene Backlund (age 78 who, lives on Miramar Plaza) is a professional racewalker and has competed and won numerous races throughout the world? She also holds world records in the sport of racewalking! If you're up at the crack of dawn, you just might spot her racewalk training around Fairway Circle in the very early morning hours.

Darlene has been featured in numerous local and national

publications talking about her love of racewalking and competing, what keeps her "young and active", and her enthusiastic attitude toward living and exercise. A recent such article appeared in a publication called 'Geezer Jock' by Ray Glier entitled A Racewalker At 78 Thrives With Habits. Why We Need Habits To Thrive "Life is meant to be an adventure and Darlene keeps the adventure percolating with the racewalk, which includes warm-up walks, cool down walks, static stretches in the evening, interval training, dynamic stretches, and aerobics. Her racewalk is five days a week—either 4 miles or 12-13 miles—and is more than habit. It's a cathedral, a bedrock, and identity. It's what Backlund does and what she is known for, a sport she has enjoyed since age 50. It's easy to rise at 5 and have your body cooperate with a sport under those circumstances."

"I want to racewalk when I'm 95," said Darlene, who is already the oldest woman on the planet to complete a certified 50k racewalk. "I want to die crossing the finish line of a racewalk...." Darlene starts each day with 10 cups of coffee and ends the day with a half-cup of salted caramel ice cream just before bed at 9 p.m. In between, her cup runneth over, as they say. Life is a participatory exercise and Darlene participates...one cup at a time."
